- **Protect Pipes:** Insulate exposed pipes in unheated areas like basements and garages to prevent freezing and bursting.
- Prepare Emergency Supplies: Stock up on essentials like flashlights, batteries, blankets, and a first aid kit in case of winter storms or power outages.
